# **Getting started**

The instructions in this User guide, unless otherwise stated, are written on the basis that you access your phone's functions from the default **Home** screen. If you set Timescape™ or another application as your home screen, the instruction path may differ.

### To access the User guide in your phone

From the Home screen, tap the applications bar > User guide.


# **Assembly**

To insert the SIM card and the memory card



- 1 Remove the battery cover.
- 2 Slide the SIM card and the memory card into the holders with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.

# To remove the memory card



 Remove the battery cover and press the edge of the memory card to release and remove it.

### To insert the battery



- 1 Insert the battery with the label side up and the connectors facing each other.
- 2 Attach the battery cover.

# Turning the phone on and off

The first time you turn on the phone, the Welcome menu appears.

### To turn on the phone

- 1 Press and hold down the (1) key on the top of the phone.
- 2 Enter your SIM card PIN, if requested, and select **OK**.
- 3 At first startup, follow the instructions in the Welcome menu.
- Your PIN is supplied by your network operator. If you want to correct a mistake made while entering your SIM card PIN, press ...

### To turn off the phone

- 1 Press and hold ① until the options menu opens.
- 2 In the options menu, tap Power off.
- 3 Tap **OK**.

### To activate the screen

• Press any of the hardware keys. The phone is also activated when you receive a call.

### **Connect and communicate**

# Settings for calling, messaging and the Internet

In order to call, send messages and use the Internet you will need a 2G/3G mobile data connection. You can also send emails and access the Internet by connecting to a Wi-Fi™ network.

- For most mobile phone networks and operators, settings for calling, messaging and the Internet will be preinstalled on the phone or automatically downloaded to your phone the first time you turn on the phone with a SIM card inserted. If not, you can go to www.sonyericsson.com/support from your computer to download the settings to your phone. If you want to manually add or change any network settings, see Network settings on page 20 for more information.
- Using a Wi-Fi connection you can access the Internet wirelessly with your phone. You can browse the Internet at home (personal Wi-Fi networks) or in public access zones (hot spots). Personal Wi-Fi networks are usually protected. A pass phrase or a key is then required from the Wi-Fi network administrator. Hot spots are usually non-protected but often require you to log on to the operator's service before you get Internet access. See the Wi-Fi™ section on page 47 for more information.

### Social web services

You can use your phone with many web based services, for example, social networking and media sharing.

- You can set up your Facebook<sup>™</sup> and Twitter<sup>™</sup> accounts to use them with Sony Ericsson Timescape<sup>™</sup> and your phone contacts. See *Facebook* <sup>™</sup> and *Twitter*<sup>™</sup> setup on page 36.
- You can share photos and videos using a number of web services. See **Setting up** accounts for online services on page 64.

## Google™ account

You can set up a Google account in your phone to use with the Google Mail™, Google Talk and Calendar applications.

### To set up a Google™ account in your phone

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Online service accounts > "Google".
- Follow the registration wizard to create a Google account, or sign in if you already have an account.
- 4 Your phone is now ready to use with Google Mail™, Google Talk and Calendar.
- It is also possible to create or set up a Google™ account from the "Welcome!" menu the first time you start the phone. You can also create a Google account by going to <a href="https://www.google.com/accounts">www.google.com/accounts</a> in the web browser of your computer.

## To delete a Google™ account from your phone

- Performing this task may reset all user data in all Google<sup>TM</sup> services in your phone. You will need to sign in with your Google account to use these services again. Make sure you have saved and made backups of all data in your phone before you proceed. For more information on how to make a complete reset of the phone, see *Resetting the phone* on page 90.
- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Applications > Manage applications.
- 3 Scroll down and tap Google Mail™.
- 4 Tap Clear data.
- 5 Press <□.
- 6 Scroll down and tap Google Apps.
- 7 Tap Clear data.

# Synchronising and handling content


You can synchronise and transfer many types of files, documents and information between your phone, a computer or the Internet. You can for example:

- Use a USB cable to connect your phone to a computer. You can then transfer content
  between the phone and the computer. See *Using a USB cable* on page 53 for more
  information.
- Use the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application to transfer and handle music, pictures and videos on your phone and PC. See the *Media Go<sup>™</sup>* section on page 55 for more information.
- Use the Sony Ericsson sync application to synchronise contacts and calendar events. It is
  possible to synchronise this content between your phone and the web, making it possible
  to access the content from any computer, wherever you are. See Sony Ericsson sync on

# **Notification LED**

The Notification LED is located at the top right corner. It provides information on the phone status and on pending notifications.

### **LED** status

Status	Indication
Green	The battery is almost charged (90-100%)
Flashing green	You have a pending notification
Flashing red	The battery level is low. The battery is charging and the battery level is still low

The LED is turned off when charging is completed.

### **Sensors**

Your phone has two built-in sensors – a light sensor and a proximity sensor. The light sensor is used for automatic LCD backlight control. The proximity sensor turns the touch screen off when your face touches the screen. This prevents you from unintentionally activating phone functions when you are engaged in a call.

# Charging the battery

The phone battery is partly charged when you buy the phone.



### To charge the phone using the power adapter

Connect the phone to a power outlet using the USB cable and the power adapter.

### To charge the phone using a computer

 Connect the phone to a USB port on a computer using the USB cable included in the phone kit.

## Maximising battery performance

You can use the following methods to improve your battery performance:

- Decrease the brightness of the screen.
- Charge your phone often. The battery lasts longer if you charge it frequently.
- If you are in an area with no coverage, your phone repeatedly scans for available networks.
   This consumes power. If you cannot move to an area with better coverage, turn off your phone temporarily.
- Turn off 3G, Bluetooth™ wireless technology and the Wi-Fi™ connection when you do not need these functions.
- Do not cover the phone antenna when you are engaged in a call or when transferring data.
   The antenna is located at the back of phone

# Using the touch screen

# To open or highlight an item

Tap the item.

### To zoom

- When available, tap or to zoom in or out.
- You may have to drag the screen (in any direction) to make the zoom icons appear.

#### To pan

• When this option is available, drag the screen to pan.

### To mark or unmark options

• Tap the relevant checkbox or radio button to mark or unmark an option.



# **Scrolling**

You can scroll up or down, and on some webpages you can also scroll to the sides.

Dragging or flicking will not activate anything on the screen.

### To scroll



- Drag up or down to scroll.
- Flick to scroll quickly. You can wait for the scrolling to come to a stop or you can stop it immediately by tapping the screen.

### Orientation

When you turn the phone sideways, the screen orientation changes automatically between portrait and landscape view. You can also set the phone to stay in portrait orientation by disabling the automatic orientation setting.

### To prevent the screen orientation from changing automatically

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Sound & display.
- 3 Unmark the **Orientation** check box.
- Preventing the screen orientation from changing automatically means that the phone stays in portrait orientation.

### To set the screen orientation to automatic

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Sound & display.
- 3 Mark the Orientation check box.

# List

Some lists have an alphabetic index on the side. Drag your finger along the index to scroll through the index letters.



### To jump directly to an index letter

• From any list with index letters, tap the letter you want to select on the index.

- 2 Select an option.

### To insert a smiley

- 1 When you enter text, tap 

  .
- 2 Select an option.

### To add words to the User dictionary

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Locale & text > Standard keyboard > My words.
- 3 Press III.
- 4 Tap **Add** and tap the text bar to open the keyboard.
- 5 Write the word and tap **OK**.

### To use the landscape keyboard

• When the keyboard is available, turn the phone sideways.

### Status bar

- 6 Tap Set.

### To set the time

- 2 Tap Settings > Date & time.
- 3 Unmark the Automatic checkbox, if it is marked
- 4 Tap Set time
- 5 Tap + or to adjust the hour and minute.
- 6 Tap "AM" to change to "PM" or vice versa.
- 7 Tap **Set**.
- You have to unmark Use 24-hour format if you want to change "AM" to "PM".

#### To set the time zone

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Date & time.
- 3 Unmark the **Automatic** checkbox, if it is marked.
- 4 Tap **Select time zone**.
- 5 Select an option.

### To set the hour format

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Date & time > Use 24-hour format.
- 3 Mark the check box to shift between 12 hour or 24 hour format.

#### To set the date format

- From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Date & time > Select date format.
- 3 Select an option.

### Ringer settings

### To set a phone ringtone

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Sound & display > Phone ringtone.
- 3 Select a ringtone.

### To enable touch tones

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Sound & display.
- 3 Select the Audible touch tones or Audible selection.

### To select a notification ringtone

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Sound & display > Notification ringtone.
- 3 Select a ringtone and tap **OK**.

### To set the vibrating alert

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Sound & display.
- 3 Mark the Phone vibrate check box.

### Adjusting the volume

You can adjust the ringtone volume for phone calls and notifications as well as for music and video playback.

# To adjust the ringer volume with the volume key

Press the volume key up or down.

### To adjust the media playing volume with the volume key

• When playing music or watching video, press the volume key up or down.

### To set the phone to silent mode

- 1 Press and hold (1) on the top of the phone.
- 2 Tap Silent mode.

### To adjust the screen brightness

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Sound & display > Brightness.
- 3 To decrease the screen brightness, drag the slider to the left. To increase the screen brightness, drag the slider to the right.
- 4 Tap **OK**.

### To adjust the idle time before the screen turns off

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Sound & display > Screen timeout.
- 3 Select an option.
- To turn off the screen quickly, press ().

# To keep the screen on while charging the phone

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Applications > Development.
- 3 Mark the Stay awake check box.

# Phone language

You can select a language to use in your phone.

### To change the phone language

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Locale & text > Select locale.
- 3 Select an option.
- If you choose the wrong language and cannot read the menu texts, go to www.sonyericsson.com/support for help.

## Airplane mode

In Airplane mode, no radio transmissions are made by the phone.

### To turn on Airplane mode

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls.
- 3 Mark the Airplane mode check box.

### SIM card

The SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card, which you get from your network operator, contains information about your subscription. Always turn off your phone and detach the charger before you insert or remove the SIM card.

You can save contacts on the SIM card before you remove it from your phone.

### PIN

You may need a PIN (Personal Identification Number) to activate the services and functions in your phone. Each PIN digit appears as \*, unless it starts with emergency number digits, for example, 112 or 911. You can call an emergency number without entering a PIN.

### Memory

You can save content on a memory card, in the phone memory and on the SIM card. Music, video clips and photos are saved on the memory card while applications, contacts and messages are saved in the phone memory. You can export and import contacts and

messages to the memory card for backup purposes. Contacts can also be saved on the SIM card.

### Memory card

You may have to purchase a memory card separately.

Your phone supports a microSD™ memory card, which is used for media content. This type of card can also be used as a portable memory card with other compatible devices.

Without a memory card you cannot use the camera, nor can you play or download music files and video clips.

# **Network settings**

Your phone automatically switches between 2G and 3G networks depending on availability. Some network operators allow you to switch networks manually.

### To see the current network connection

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Mobile networks.
- 3 Tap Access Point Names.
- If you have several available connections, a marked radio button to the right indicates the active network connection.

### To configure Internet settings manually

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Mobile networks > Access Point Names.
- 3 Press III.
- 4 Tap New APN.
- 5 Tap **Name** and enter the name of the network profile you want to create.
- 6 Tap APN and enter the access point name.
- 7 Tap and enter all other information required by your network operator.
- 8 Press # and tap Save.
- Contact your network operator for detailed information about your network settings.

# Using other networks

Roaming, that is, calling, messaging and downloading data outside your home network, may incur additional costs. Contact your network operator for more information.

# To turn off automatic network selection

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Mobile networks > Network operators.
- 3 Tap Search networks.
- 4 Select a network.
- If you select a network manually your phone will not search for another network, even if you move out of range of the manually selected network. It is recommended to enable automatic network selection.

### To activate automatic network selection

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Mobile networks > Network operators.
- 3 Tap Select automatically.

# **Advanced network settings**

### To change network mode

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Mobile networks.
- 3 Tap Network Mode.
- 4 Select your preferred network mode.

# **Data roaming**

Depending on your network operator, it might be possible to allow mobile data connections via 2G/3G outside of your home network (roaming). Please note that data transmission charges may apply. Contact your network operator for more information.

Applications may sometimes use the Internet connection in your home network without any notification, for example, when sending search and synchronisation requests.

### To activate data roaming

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Mobile networks.
- 3 Mark the **Data roaming** checkbox.

# Home screen

The **Home** screen is the starting point of your phone. You can personalise the **Home** screen by adding, for example, applications, shortcuts and widgets, or by changing the wallpaper. The **Home** screen extends beyond the screen width, giving you more space to personalise.

When you go to the **Home** screen, some applications may continue to run in the background. If you do not want applications to run in the background, you should exit each application you have opened before going to the **Home** screen.



### To view the extended Home screen

• Drag your finger to the sides to view the entire **Home** screen.

### To change the Home screen wallpaper

- 1 From the **Home** screen, press ::...
- 2 Tap Wallpaper.
- 3 Tap Pictures or Wallpaper gallery.
- 4 Tap Save or Set wallpaper.

### To add a Home screen item

- 1 From the **Home** screen, press  $\boxplus$  and tap **Add**.
- 2 In the Add to Home screen menu, select the item you want to add.

### To move an item to an area of the extended Home screen

- 1 Touch and hold an item on the **Home** screen until it magnifies and the phone vibrates.
- 2 Drag the item to the left or right.
- 3 Release the item.

### To delete a Home screen item

- 1 Touch and hold the item until appears at the bottom of the screen.
- 2 Drag the item to many and hold until the bottom of the screen lights up.
- 3 Release the item.

### To add a folder to the Home screen

- 1 From the **Home** screen, press :::.
- 2 Tap Add > Folder.
- 3 Select the folder type you want to add.

### To add items to a folder

- 1 Touch and hold an application icon until it magnifies and the phone vibrates.
- 2 Drag the application icon over to the folder.

### To rename a folder

- 1 Tap the folder to open it.
- 2 Touch and hold the folder's title bar to open the **Rename folder** dialog box.
- 3 Enter the **Folder name** and tap **OK**.

# To add widgets to the Home screen

- 1 Touch and hold on the **Home** screen until the **Add to Home screen** menu appears.
- 2 Tap Widgets.
- 3 Select an option.

# To create a shortcut from the applications screen

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Touch and hold an application until it appears on the **Home** screen.

# **Calling**

# **Emergency calls**

Your phone supports international emergency numbers, for example, 112 or 911. You can normally use these numbers to make emergency calls in any country, with or without the SIM card inserted, if you are within range of a network.

### To make an emergency call

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap **Dialer**.
- 2 Enter the emergency number and tap "Call". To delete a number, tap ...
- You can make an emergency call without a SIM card inserted.

### To make an emergency call while the SIM card is locked

- 1 Tap Emergency call.
- 2 Enter the emergency number and tap "Call". To delete a number, tap ...

# **Call handling**

### To make a call

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap **Dialer**.
- 2 Enter the number of the recipient and tap "Call". To delete a number, tap ...

#### To end a call

• Tap "End call".

### To make an international call

- 1 From Home screen, tap Dialer.
- 2 Touch and hold down 0 until a "+" sign appears.
- 3 Enter the country code, area code (without the first 0) and phone number, then tap "Call".

### To answer a call

- If the screen is unlocked, tap "Answer" to answer the call.
- If the screen is locked, unlock it to answer the call.
- If you are using regular headphones without a microphone, you have to remove the headphones from the headset connector to be able to answer the call.

### To decline a call

Tap "Decline".

### To change the ear speaker volume during a call

Press the volume key up or down.

### To turn on the loudspeaker during a call

- 1 Press :::
- 2 Tap Speaker.

### To mute the microphone during a call

- 1 Press #.
- 2 Tap Mute.

### To enter numbers during a call

- 1 During a call, drag the iii icon (at the bottom of the screen) upwards. A keypad appears.
- 2 Enter numbers.

### To mute the ringtone for an incoming call

• When you receive the call, press the volume key.

### Recent calls

In the call log, you can view recently missed , received and dialled calls.

### To view missed calls

- 1 When you have missed calls, appears in the status bar. Drag the status bar downwards.
- 2 Tap Missed call.

### To call a number from the call log

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap **Dialer** > **Call log**.
- 2 Tap \( next to the desired number.

### To add a number from the call log to your contacts

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap **Dialer** > **Call log**.
- 2 Tap and hold the number, then tap Add to contacts.
- 3 Tap the desired contact, or tap Create new contact.
- 4 Edit the contact details and tap **Save**.

### Voicemail

If your subscription includes an answering service, callers can leave a voicemail message when you cannot answer a call. Usually, the voicemail number is saved on the SIM card. If not, contact your service provider to get your voicemail number. You can then enter the number manually.

### To enter your voicemail number

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap **Settings** > **Call settings** > **Voicemail**.
- 2 Enter your voicemail number.
- 3 Tap **OK**.

### To call your voicemail service

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap **Dialer**.
- 2 Touch and hold down 1.

### More than one call

You can handle multiple calls at the same time by switching between the calls. You can turn on a notification to sound if you receive another call during an ongoing call (call waiting). If you have activated call waiting, you will be notified by a beep if you receive another call.

### To activate or deactivate call waiting

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Call settings > GSM call settings.
- 3 To activate or deactivate call waiting, tap **Call waiting**.

### To reject a second call

• When you hear repeated beeps during a call, tap "Busy".

### To answer a second call and end the ongoing call

• When you hear repeated beeps during a call, tap "End call & answer".

### To answer a second call and put the ongoing call on hold

• When you hear repeated beeps during a call, tap "Answer".

### To make a second call

- 1 During an ongoing call, press ⊞, then tap +.
- 2 Enter the number of the recipient and tap "Call".
- 3 If the recipient answers, the first call is put on hold.
- The same procedure applies to subsequent calls.

### To switch between multiple calls

• To switch to the next call and put the current call on hold, tap "Swap calls".

### To end the ongoing call and return to the next call on hold

• Tap "End call".

### Conference calls

With a conference or multiparty call, you can have a joint conversation with two or more persons.

### To start a conference call

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap **Dialer**.
- 2 Dial the number to the first participant and tap "Call".

### To add another participant to a conference call

- 1 During the call, press :::, then tap +.
- 2 Dial the number to the second participant and tap "Call".
- 3 When the second participant has answered, press \; then tap \( \bigcirc\).

# To have a private conversation with a participant

- 1 During the call, press \( \mathbb{H} \), then tap \( \bigsize \sigma \).
- 2 Tap la next to the desired participant.
- 3 To return to the conference call, press :: , then tap <...

### To release a participant

- 2 Tap next to the desired participant.

### To end a conference call

• During the call, tap "End call".

# Call settings

### Forwarding calls

You can forward calls, for example, to another phone number, or to an answering service.

### To forward calls

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Call settings > GSM call settings > Call forwarding.
- 3 Select an option.
- 4 Enter the number you want to forward the calls to and tap **Enable**.

### To turn off call forwarding

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Call settings > GSM call settings > Call forwarding.
- 3 Select an option.
- 4 Tap Disable.

# Showing or hiding your phone number

You can select to show or hide the phone number that is displayed on call recipients' devices when you call them.

## To show or hide your phone number

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Call settings > GSM call settings > Caller ID.
- 3 Select an option.

# **Fixed Dialing Numbers**

If you have received a PIN2 code from your service provider, you can use a list of Fixed Dialing Numbers (FDN) to restrict outgoing and incoming calls.

# To enable or disable fixed dialing

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Call settings > "Fixed Dialing Numbers".
- 3 Tap Enable FDN or Disable FDN.
- 4 Enter your PIN2 and tap **OK**.

# To access the list of accepted call recipients

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Call settings > "Fixed Dialing Numbers" > FDN list.

# **Contacts**

In "Phonebook", you can enter all your information for your personal contacts, for example, phone numbers, email adresses and web service accounts. When you view a contact, you get quick access to all communication with that contact.

### To view your contacts

- From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **"Phonebook"**.
- From the Home screen, tap Dialer > Contacts
- The first time you open "Phonebook", a setup wizard starts. You can set up your phone for synchronising contacts with an online service, and you can import contacts from your SIM card or memory card.

# "Phonebook" screen overview

In the "Phonebook" application, you can view your contacts and all communication with them through different media. You can add a contact picture, and also link the contact to a Facebook and a Twitter account. The contact picture and status is shown directly in the list of contacts.

- 5 When you are finished, tap **Save**.

#### To search for a contact

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap "Phonebook".
- 2 Enter the first few letters of the contact name in the search field. All contacts beginning with those letters appear.

### To edit a contact

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap "Phonebook".
- 2 Tap the contact you want to edit.
- 3 Tap "Edit".
- 4 Edit the desired information and tap **Save**.

### To delete contacts

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **"Phonebook"**.
- 2 Press : then tap "Delete contacts".
- 3 Mark the contacts you want to delete, or tap "Mark all" if you want to delete all contacts.
- 4 Tap "Delete".

### To call a contact

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap "Phonebook".
- 2 Tap the contact.
- 3 Tap the desired phone number of the contact.

### To edit contact information about yourself

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **"Phonebook"**.
- 2 Tap "My number:" at the top of the contact list.
- 3 Tap "Edit".
- 4 Enter the new information or make the changes you want.
- 5 When you are done, tap **Save**.

### To send your business card via Bluetooth wireless technology

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **"Phonebook"**.
- 2 Tap "My number:".
- 3 Press ;; then tap "Send business card".
- 4 Select a device from the list.

### **Favourites**

You can mark a contact as a favourite. The **Favorites** list provides quick access to the contacts you have marked.

### To mark a contact as a favourite

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **"Phonebook"**.
- 2 Tap the contact you want to mark.
- 3 Tap ★.

# Linking phone and web content to a contact

By using photo tags, you can link photos to a contact. You can also link a phone contact to the same person's Facebook and Twitter accounts.

### To add a photo to a contact

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap "Phonebook".
- 2 Tap the contact.
- 3 Tap "Edit".
- 4 Tap ⊕ 1.
- 5 Select **Camera roll** if you want to add a saved photo to the contact, or **Camera** if you want to take a photo and add it.
- 6 When you have added the photo, it appears next to the contact name. Tap Save to confirm.

### To link a Facebook or Twitter contact to a phone contact

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap "Phonebook".
- 2 Tap the contact.
- 3 Tap "Edit".
- 4 Tap 

  → next to "Link contact".
- 5 Select "Facebook" or "Twitter". A list of your Twitter or Facebook contacts appears.
- 6 Select the contact you want to link to the phone contact.
- 7 Tap Save to confirm.

### The contact information filter

When you are viewing a contact, you can tap or flick through the filter options at the bottom of the screen:

"Info"	Contact phone numbers and addresses	
Call log	Call history for the contact.	
"Messaging"	All text and multimedia message conversations with the contact	
"Email"	All email messages from the contact	
"My photos"	All photos in the photo album which are linked to the contact.	
"Twitter"	All Twitter status updates for the contact. Appears if you have linked a Twitter account to the contact.	
"Facebook"	All Facebook status updates for the contact. Appears if you have linked a Facebook account to the contact.	

# **Backing up contacts**

You can use the memory card and SIM card for backing up contacts. This is useful, for example, when you want to transfer the contact information to another phone.

You can also use a synchronisation service for backing up your contacts. For more information, see *Synchronising and handling content* on page 7.

### To back up all contacts on the memory card

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **"Phonebook"**.
- 2 Press ₩, then tap More > "Back up contacts" > "Memory card".
- 3 Tap "Back up".
- 4 Tap "OK".

### To import contacts from the memory card

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap "Phonebook".
- 2 Press : then tap More > Import contacts > "Memory card".
- 3 A list appears showing different backup batches of all phone contacts. Select the desired backup.
- 4 Tap **OK**.
- If you select "Replace all contacts", all existing phone contact information is replaced.

### To back up names and numbers on the SIM card

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **"Phonebook"**.
- 2 Press : then tap More > "Back up contacts" > "SIM card".
- 3 Mark the contacts you want to copy, or tap "Mark all".
- 4 Tap "Back up".
- 5 Select "Add contacts" or "Replace all contacts".
- If you select "Replace all contacts", all existing SIM card information is replaced.
- When you copy a contact to the SIM card, only the contact name and one number is saved. This is due to limited memory on a SIM card.

### To import contacts from the SIM card

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **"Phonebook"**.
- 2 Press :::, then tap More > Import contacts > "SIM card".

# SMS and MMS

# Before using SMS and MMS

You can send text messages from your phone using SMS (Short Message Service). If your subscription includes MMS (Multimedia Messaging Service), you can also send and receive multimedia messages that contain pictures, videos and music. You can also send multimedia messages to an email address.

- To send multimedia messages, you need the correct MMS settings in the phone. See Settings for calling, messaging and the Internet on page 6.
- For more information on entering text, see *Entering text* on page 12.

# Using SMS and MMS

### To create and send a message

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Tap New message.
- 3 Enter one or more recipient numbers or email addresses.
- 4 Enter your message text.
- If you want to add a photo, video or sound, press \; then tap **Attach** and select an option.
- 6 Tap Send.

### To receive and read a message

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Select a message thread from the list.
- 3 If the received message is an multimedia message, tap **Download** if you have not enabled automatic download.
- 4 If the received message contains a music or a video, tap 

  to play.
- When you receive a text or multimedia message, appears in the status bar. To read the message, you can also drag the status bar downwards.

### To delete a message thread

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Select a message thread.
- 3 Press  $\boxplus$ , then tap **More** > **Delete thread**.

### To save a number in a received message to a contact

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Select a message thread.
- 3 Press :, then tap More > Add to Contacts.
- 4 Tap the contact you want to add the number to, or tap Create new contact.

### To save a multimedia message attachment

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Select a message thread.
- 3 Touch and hold the attachment, then tap Copy attached to SD card.

### To change the notification settings for messages

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Press : then tap Settings.
- 3 Select an option.

### To change the download settings for received multimedia messages

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Press : then tap **Settings**.
- 3 If you want received multimedia messages to be downloaded automatically, mark the **Auto-retrieve** checkbox.
- 4 If you also want received multimedia messages do be downloaded automatically when roaming, mark the **Roaming auto-retrieve** checkbox.

### To back up messages on the memory card

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Press #, then tap "Save to SD".

### To import messages from the memory card

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Press : then tap "Import from SD".

### To delete all message threads

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Messaging**.
- 2 Press = then tap Delete threads.

# **Email**

You can use your phone to send and receive emails through your regular email account. First, you need the correct Internet settings in your phone. See **Settings for calling**, **messaging and the Internet** on page 6.

You can set up a Microsoft® Exchange ActiveSync® synchronisation by using the Moxier™ Sync application in your phone. You can then use the Moxier™ Mail application in your phone with an email account on a Microsoft® Exchange Server. See www.moxier.com for more information.

# Setting up email

If you enter your account settings in the **Email** setup wizard, you can view your email messages in Sony Ericsson Timescape™.

### To set up an email account in your phone for the first time

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Email**.
- 2 Tap Next.
- 3 Enter your email address and password, and tap **Done**.
- 4 Tap Next.
- If the phone cannot download your email account settings automatically, tap **Manual** setup and enter the account settings manually.

- 4 To open and read a message, tap the message.
- If you have changed the email settings and set an **Email checking frequency**, appears in the status bar when you receive a new message. You can drag the status bar downwards to read the message.

### To save email message attachment

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Email**.
- 2 If you have several email accounts, select the account that received the relevant message.
- 3 Tap the message. The attachments appear in a list at the bottom of the view.
- 4 Select the attachment you want to save and tap **Save**. The attachment is saved to the memory card.

### To reply to an email message

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Email**.
- If you have several accounts, select the account that received the relevant message.
- Tap the message you want to reply to.
- 4 Tap Reply or Reply all.
- 5 Enter text and tap **Send**.

### To forward an email message

- 4 The message appears with quoted text and attachments. To remove the quoted text or attachment, tap **x**.
- 5 Enter some text, if desired, and tap **Send**.

### To delete an email message

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Email**.
- 2 If you have several accounts, select the account that received the relevant message.
- 3 Touch and hold the message, then tap **Delete**.

### **Email accounts**

# To change the settings for an email account

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Email**.
- 2 Press :::, then tap Accounts.
- 3 Touch and hold the desired account, then tap **Account settings**.
- 4 Tap **Email checking frequency** and select a check time interval.
- Mark the **Default account** checkbox if you want to use this account for all outgoing emails.
- 6 Mark the Email notifications check box if you want notifications for new email messages to appear in the status bar.

### To add an extra email account in your phone

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Email**.
- 2 Press #, then tap Accounts.
- 3 Press \; then tap Add account.
- 4 Enter the email address and password, and tap Done. If you want, mark the checkbox Send email from this account by default. Tap Next. If the settings for the email account cannot be downloaded automatically, tap Manual setup and complete the setup manually.
- 5 Enter an account name and the name you want displayed on outgoing messages. Tap **Done**.

### To remove an email account from your phone

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Email**.
- 2 Press :, then tap **Accounts**.
- 3 Touch and hold the desired account, then tap Remove account > OK.

# Google™ email

If you have a Google account, you can use it with the Google Mail™ application in your phone. When you have set up the Google account in your phone, you can chat using the Google Talk application and synchronise the Calendar application with your Google Calendar. ### To open Google Mail™

From the Home screen, tap the applications bar, then tap Google Mail™.

You can set up your Facebook and Twitter accounts to work in your phone. You can then update your status or view posts from your contacts in Sony Ericsson Timescape™ and in "Phonebook".

#### To reply to a text or multimedia message in Timescape™

- 4 If desired, press ## and tap **Attach** to insert an attachment.
- 5 Tap Send.

#### To reply to an email message in Timescape™

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap "Timescape™".
- 2 Double-tap an email message tile.
- 3 Tap Reply or Reply all.
- 4 Enter the text and tap **Send**.

#### To link a Facebook or Twitter contact to a phone contact in Timescape™

- From the Home screen, tap "Timescape™".
- 2 Tap a Facebook or Twitter tile.
- 3 Tap ∞.
- 4 Tap "Add to contact".

#### To view all communication with a contact

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap "Timescape™".
- 2 Tap a tile for a missed call, text/multimedia/email message or Facebook/Twitter update.
- 3 Tap . All communication with the contact appears.
- 4 Tap or flick the filter items at the bottom of the screen to view communication with the contact through other media.

#### To view related photo album material for a recently taken photo

- From the Home screen, tap "Timescape™".
- 2 Tap a tile for a recently taken photo or video, then tap ...
- You can filter the displayed photos by "Same date", "Same location", or by contact name.
- The phone will display as related content other photos which are tagged with the same contact names, date or location. Related photos are displayed for a maximum of five contacts.

#### To view related phone and web material for a recently played song

# To reply to an instant message with Google Talk

# Calendar

Your phone has a calendar for managing your time schedule. If you have Sony Ericsson Synchronisation or a Google account, you can also synchronise the phone calendar with your web calendar. See *Synchronising and handling content* on page 7.

You can set up a Microsoft® Exchange ActiveSync® synchronisation by using the Moxier™ Sync application in your phone. #### To set the calendar view

- 4 If you have multiple calendar accounts, select the desired calendar.
- 5 If desired, select a recurrence interval for the event.
- 6 Select reminder intervals for the event. To add a new reminder for the event, tap  $\oplus$ .
- 7 Tap Done.

#### To view a calendar event

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Calendar**.
- 2 Tap the event you want to view.

#### To dismiss or snooze an event reminder

- 1 When the reminder icon 1 appears in the status bar, drag the status bar downwards. The notification panel opens.
- 2 Tap the desired event.
- 3 Tap "Dismiss all" or "Snooze all".

#### To change the calendar settings

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar, then tap **Calendar**.
- 2 Press : then tap More > Settings.
- 3 Select the setting you want to change.
- You can change the general view and reminder settings.

# **Synchronising**

Synchronising between your phone and computer is an easy and practical way of keeping track of the same contacts, messages, calendar events on your computer as well as in your phone. It is possible to synchronise your phone in several different ways, depending on your preferred service and what content you want to synchronise.

It is possible to use Sony Ericsson sync to synchronise contacts and calendar events, and to use Google sync to synchronise your Google™ email, calendar and contacts. You can also set up a Microsoft® Exchange ActiveSync® synchronisation by using the Moxier™ Sync application in your phone. See www.moxier.com for more information.

# Sony Ericsson sync

Use the Sony Ericsson sync application to synchronise contacts and calendar events between your phone and the Sony Ericsson website *www.sonyericsson.com/user*. You can then access, edit and add information from any computer with an Internet connection.

A Sony Ericsson account is required to access the synchronised information at www.sonyericsson.com/user. This account can be created and set up from your phone, or you can create one at www.sonyericsson.com/user.

You can set up automatic synchronisations when you set up Sony Ericsson sync, or you can do so manually later. You need to select Sony Ericsson sync as your default synchronisation service in order to do this.

Sony Ericsson sync can be set up to connect to any SyncML™ service.

### To select Sony Ericsson sync as the default synchronisation service

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Data synchronisation > Select sync application.
- 3 Select Sony Ericsson.

# To set up Sony Ericsson sync in your phone

- 5 Toggle between the two tabs and edit the information needed.

#### To set up automatic synchronisations in Sony Ericsson sync

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > "Data synchronisation".
- 3 Tap "Sony Ericsson Sync".
- 4 Touch and hold the synchronisation item.

- 6 Scroll down and mark the **Auto synchronisation** checkbox in the **Edit account** tab.

# Google™ sync

You can use the Google sync application to synchronise the phone with your Google™ email, calendar and contacts. You can view and edit information both in your phone and on your computer.

To synchronise with your Google<sup>™</sup> account, the account needs to be activated in your phone. You can synchronise manually, or set the phone to synchronise automatically by activating background data usage. See *To set up a Google* <sup>™</sup> *account in your phone* on page 7 for more information.

# To select Google sync as the default synchronisation service

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Data synchronisation > Select sync application.
- 3 Select "Google".

## To set up automatic synchronisations in Google sync

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- Tap Settings > "Synchronise data".
   Tap "Google sync".
- 4 Mark the Background data checkbox.
- 5 Mark the **Auto-sync** checkbox.
- 6 Mark the checkboxes for the synchronisation items you want to synchronise automatically.
- 7 Press < ...
- 8 Mark the checkbox to enable automatic synchronisation for Google Mail™.

# To stop synchronisation in Google sync

- 1 When synchronising, press #...
- 2 Tap Cancel sync.

# Wi-Fi<sup>TM</sup>

Using Wi-Fi™ you can access the Internet wirelessly with your phone.

# Before using Wi-Fi™

To be able to browse the Internet using a Wi-Fi<sup>TM</sup> connection you need to search for and connect to an available Wi-Fi network and then open the Internet browser. The signal strength of the Wi-Fi network may differ depending on your phone's location. Moving closer to the Wi-Fi router might enhance the signal strength.

#### To turn on Wi-Fi™

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls.
- 3 Mark the Wi-Fi checkbox. The phone will now scan for available Wi-Fi networks.
- It may take a few seconds before the Wi-Fi connection is enabled.

#### To connect to a Wi-Fi™ network

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings.
- Available Wi-Fi networks are displayed under **Wi-Fi networks**. The available networks may be open or secured. This is indicated by a next to the Wi-Fi network name.
- 4 Tap a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If you are trying to connect to a protected Wi-Fi network, you are asked to enter the security key for that Wi-Fi network before you can connect to it. is displayed in the status bar once you are connected.
- The next time you connect to a Wi-Fi™ network the phone will remember the security key.

# To connect to another Wi-Fi™ network

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings. Detected Wi-Fi networks are displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- 3 Tap another Wi-Fi network to connect to it.

# Wi-Fi™ network status

When you are connected to a Wi-Fi™ network or when there are Wi-Fi networks available in your vicinity, it is possible to see the status of these Wi-Fi networks. You can also enable the phone to notify you whenever a Wi-Fi network is detected.

#### To enable Wi-Fi™ network notification

- 1 Make sure Wi-Fi is turned on.
- 2 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 3 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings.
- 4 Tap **Network notification**.

## To scan for Wi-Fi™ networks manually

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3 Press III.
- 4 Tap Scan. The phone scans for Wi-Fi networks and displays them in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- 5 Tap a Wi-Fi network in the list to connect to the network.

# Advanced Wi-Fi™ settings

Before you add a Wi-FI™ network manually, you need to turn on the Wi-Fi setting in your phone.

#### To add a Wi-Fi™ network manually

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3 Tap Add Wi-Fi network.
- 4 Enter the **Network SSID** name of the Wi-Fi network you want to add.
- 5 Tap the **Security** field to select a security type for the Wi-Fi network you want to add
- 6 Enter the Wireless password for the Wi-Fi network you want to add, if required.
- 7 Tap Save.
- Contact your Wi-Fi network administrator to get the Network SSID name and Wireless password.

#### To view detailed information on a connected Wi-Fi™ network

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3 Tap the Wi-Fi network that you are currently connected to. The detailed network information will be displayed.

# Wi-Fi™ sleep policy

You can choose to disable the Wi-Fi™ functionality in your phone when the screen turns off by adding a Wi-Fi sleep policy. This will maximise the phone battery performance. You can also set the phone to never turn off the Wi-Fi functionality or to never turn it off when you are charging your phone.

The phone will use a 2G/3G mobile data connection to access the Internet if you are not connected to a Wi-Fi network.

#### To add a Wi-Fi™ sleep policy

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3 Press III.
- 4 Tap Advanced.
- 5 Tap Wi-Fi sleep policy.
- 6 Select a Wi-Fi sleep policy to use.

#### Using a static IP address

You can set up the phone to connect to a Wi-Fi™ network using a static IP address.

## To set up a static IP address

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3 Press :::.
- 4 Tap Advanced.
- 5 Mark the **Use static IP** checkbox.
- 6 Tap and enter the information needed for your Wi-Fi network:
  - IP address
  - Gateway
  - Netmask
  - DNS 1
  - DNS 2
- 7 Press # and tap Save.

# Web browser

The web browser in your phone is fully optimised and comes with advanced functionality such as wireless web and Google Search™.

You must have a Wi-Fi or an active 2G/3G mobile data connection to access the Internet.

# Before using the Internet

Your phone allows you to access the Internet using a Wi-Fi connection, or using a 2G/3G mobile data connection. To access the Internet with your phone using a 2G/3G mobile data connection, you need a phone subscription that includes data transmission and settings to use a 2G/3G mobile data connection.

In most cases, settings for connecting to the Internet using a 2G/3G mobile data connection will be automatically downloaded to your phone the first time you turn on the phone with a SIM card inserted.

To access the Internet using a Wi-Fi connection you need to be in range of a Wi-Fi network, and granted access by the network administrator.

See **Settings for calling, messaging and the Internet** on page 6 for more information on how to setup a 2G/3G mobile data connection or how to connect to a Wi-Fi network.

#### To open the browser

• From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar and tap **Browser**.

#### To go to a web page

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, press  $\mathbb{H}$  and tap **Go**.
- 2 Enter the web page address using the keyboard. As you enter the address, matching web page addresses will appear on the screen. Tap the address to go directly to that web page or continue entering the web page address.
- 3 Tap Go.
- If the screen orientation does not change automatically when you turn the phone sideways, mark the Orientation check box under Settings > Sound & display.

#### To go to the previous page while browsing

Press <□.</li>

#### To exit the browser

• To close all open windows and exit the **Browser**, press  $\mathbb{H}$  and tap **Exit**.

# Viewing web pages

Web browser offers advanced features that let you view web pages just like on a desktop computer.

You can open up to 8 browser windows. You can easily switch from one website to another by opening several windows.

#### To open a new browser window

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, press  $\blacksquare$  and tap **New window** while browsing a web page. A new browser window opens in the default home page.
- 2 If two or more browser windows are open, press \( \mathrm{H}\) and tap \( \mathrm{Windows} \) to add more browser windows.

#### To switch between browser windows

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, press  $\boxplus$  and tap **Windows**.
- 2 On the **Current windows** screen, tap the browser window you want to view.
- 3 To open a new web page, tap **New window**.
- 4 To close a browser window, tap 
  on the browser window you want to close.

#### To zoom in or out on a web page

- 1 Drag your finger in any direction on the screen to activate the zoom controls on the web page.
- 2 Tap a zoom icon.

#### To find text within a web page

- 1 When you are viewing a web page, press  $\mathbb{H}$  and tap **More** > **Find on page**.
- 2 Enter the search item. As you enter, matching characters will be highlighted in green. Tap the left or right arrow to go to the previous or next matching item.
- 3 Tap x to close the search bar.

#### To copy text from a web page

- 1 Open and zoom out of the web page where you want to copy text.
- 2 Locate the text you want to copy.
- 3 Press # and tap More > Select text.
- 4 Place your finger at the start of the text you want to copy and then drag to the end of the text you want to copy. Copied text is highlighted in pink.
- 5 Release your finger from the screen.
- To paste text in an email, text message or multimedia message, touch and hold the text box on a message or email and tap **Paste** in the menu.

#### To auto-fit the web page

• From the **Browser** screen, press  $\blacksquare$  and tap **More** > **Settings** > **Auto-fit pages**. You will now be able to view the full web page on your screen.

#### To adjust browser settings

From the Browser screen, press ## and tap More > Settings.

# Managing downloads and links

Before you can download web applications, you have to enable downloading from the phone settings. Also make sure that you have a memory card in your phone. All the applications you download are saved to the memory card.

Applications you download from websites other than Android™ Market could be of unknown and unreliable origin. To protect your phone and personal data, only download applications from trusted sources such as the Android™ Market application store.

#### To disable downloads from Android™ Market

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar and tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Applications > Manage applications.
- 3 Tap Disable Market.

# To allow download of web applications

- 1 From the **Home** screen, press  $\mathbb{H}$  and tap **Settings** > **Applications**.
- 2 Mark the Unknown sources check box.

#### To view your downloads

• From the **Browser** screen, press  $\boxplus$  and tap **More** > **Downloads**.

#### To manage links in web pages

- 1 Open the web page where you want to manage the links.
- 2 Tap the link to open the web page. The links get enclosed in an orange box when selected.
- Touch and hold the link to open a menu that allows you to open, bookmark, save, copy to the clipboard or share the link via email.
- 4 The **Browser** also recognises some phone numbers and addresses that allow you to call the phone number or locate the address in Google Maps™.
- 5 Tap the address or the phone number to locate or call.
- Google Maps™ may not be available in every market.

# Managing bookmarks and history

You can check history and store as many bookmarks on your phone as you want.

#### To bookmark a web page

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, go to the web page you want to bookmark.
- 2 Press  $\boxplus$  and tap **Bookmarks**. The bookmarks screen opens.
- 3 Tap Add bookmark.
- 4 Tap **Name** to change the name of the bookmark and tap **OK**.

#### To open a bookmark

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, press  $\boxplus$  and tap **Bookmarks**.
- 2 Tap the bookmark you want to open.
- 3 Touch and hold the bookmark to access the options from the menu, where you can open, edit, add a shortcut to, save, share and delete the bookmark.

#### To bookmark the last visited page

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, press  $\boxplus$  and tap **Bookmarks**. The bookmarks screen opens.
- 2 Press \( \exists \) and tap **Bookmark last-viewed page**. The last web page you opened has now been saved to your bookmarks.

#### To edit a bookmark

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, press  $\boxplus$  and tap **Bookmarks**.
- 2 Touch and hold the bookmark you want to edit.
- 3 Tap Edit bookmark. The edit bookmark dialog box appears.
- 4 Enter your changes and tap **OK**.

#### To check browsing history

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, press  $\blacksquare$  and tap **Bookmarks** > the **History** tab. Tap an item to open the page.
- 2 To check your most visited web pages in the past, press 

  and tap Bookmarks > the Most visited tab.

#### To clear history

- 1 From the **Browser** screen, press  $\blacksquare$  and tap **Bookmarks** > the **History** tab.
- 2 Press  $\boxplus$  and tap **Clear history**.

# **Applications and games**

You can access applications and games using the Android™ Market application store.

# **Using Applications**

You can install applications in your phone from sources other than Android™ Market. You can view and adjust settings for your installed applications. Many applications come with a wizard that helps you to install the application.

Note: Applications downloaded from websites other than Android™ Market could be of unknown or unreliable origin. To protect your phone and personal data, only download applications from trusted sources such as the Android™ Market application store.

#### To view permissions for an application in your phone

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar and tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Applications > Manage applications.
- 3 Tap the desired application.
- 4 Scroll to and tap **Permissions**.

#### To force stop an application

- When a popup window tells you that an application is not responding, tap Force stop.
- If you do not want to force stop an application, you can wait for the application to respond by tapping Cancel.

#### To clear all data for an application

- Before you clear all data for an installed application, make sure you have backed up all application-related content that you want to keep, including data saved in the application.
- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar and tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Applications > Manage applications.
- 3 Tap the desired application.
- 4 Tap Clear data.

# To delete an installed application

- Before you delete an installed application, make sure you have backed up all application-related content that you want to keep, including data saved in the application. It is not possible to delete some applications.
- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar and tap **Settings**.
- 2 Tap Applications > Manage applications.
- 3 Tap the desired application.
- 4 Tap Uninstall.

# Using Android™ Market

Android™ Market allows you to enter the world of applications and games with just a few taps. In category view you can find applications and games. There are some screenshots available to help you to browse and download applications. You can also rate an application or a game and send feedback on it.

Before using Android<sup>™</sup> Market, you need to have a Google<sup>™</sup> email account. To create a Google<sup>™</sup> account, you can follow the instructions in the phone or see *To set up a Google<sup>™</sup> account in your phone* on page 7.

# To open Android™ Market

• From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar and tap **Market**.

# Transferring and handling content

You can transfer and handle content such as pictures and music. You may not be allowed to exchange some copyright-protected material.

# Using a USB cable

You can connect your phone to a computer with a USB cable, and then manually mount the memory card of your phone to the computer from the phone menu. You can then drag and drop content between your phone and a computer.

If you are running an application on your phone and the application is is using the memory card, you may need to close the application in order to access the memory card.

# To connect your phone to a computer with a USB cable

- 1 Connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable.
- 2 To mount the memory card of your phone to your computer, drag the status bar downwards and tap USB connected > Mount.

#### To disconnect the USB cable safely

- Do not disconnect the USB cable when transferring content as this may corrupt the content.
- 1 **Computer**: Make sure to enable the hardware to be safely removed.
- 2 Phone: Drag the status bar downwards.
- 3 Tap Turn off USB storage.
- 4 Tap **Turn Off**.
- 5 Disconnect the USB cable.
- Computer instructions may vary depending on your operating system. See the documentation of your computer's operating system for more information.

# File handling

You can drag and drop content between your phone's memory card and a computer in the computer's file explorer.

#### To drag and drop content between the phone and a computer

- 1 Connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable.
- 2 Drag the status bar downwards and tap **USB connected** > **Mount**.
- **Computer**: Wait until the phone memory and memory card appear as external disks in the file explorer.
- 4 Drag and drop selected files between the phone and the computer.
- When the phone card is mounted to the computer, the phone cannot access the memory card. Some functionality and applications in the phone, such as the camera, may not be accessible then.
- You can transfer files by using a USB cable on most devices and operating systems supporting a USB Mass Storage interface.

# Using Bluetooth™ wireless technology

The Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> function creates a wireless connection to other Bluetooth devices, for example, handsfree devices. A range within 10 metres (33 feet), with no solid objects in between, is recommended. You must turn on the Bluetooth function to communicate with other devices. You may also have to pair your phone with other Bluetooth devices.

#### To turn on the Bluetooth™ function and make the phone visible

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls.
- 3 Mark the **Bluetooth** checkbox. 👔 will be displayed in the status bar.
- 4 Tap Bluetooth settings.
- 5 Mark the **Discoverable** checkbox. The phone will now be visible to other devices for 120 seconds.

#### Phone name

You can enter a name for your phone that is shown to other devices when using Bluetooth™ wireless technology.

#### To enter a phone name

- 1 Make sure Bluetooth is turned on.
- 2 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 3 Tap Settings > Bluetooth settings > Device name.
- 4 Enter the phone name.
- 5 Tap **OK**.

# Pairing with another Bluetooth™ device

When you pair your phone with another device, you can, for example, connect your phone to a Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> handsfree or a Bluetooth car kit and use these devices to make and receive calls.

Once you have paired your phone with a Bluetooth device the phone will remember this pairing. When pairing the phone with a Bluetooth device, you may need to enter a passcode. Your phone will automatically try the generic passcode 0000. If this does not work, see the documentation of your Bluetooth device for the passcode used by your Bluetooth device. You do not need to re-enter the passcode the next time you connect to a paired Bluetooth device.

Some Bluetooth devices, for example, most Bluetooth headsets, require you to also create a connection to the Bluetooth device in order for it to work properly.

You can pair your phone with several Bluetooth devices, but only connect to one Bluetooth profile at the same time. The following Bluetooth profiles are supported by the phone: Headset, Handsfree, A2DP, AVRCP, and OPP/FTP.

#### To pair the phone with another Bluetooth™ device

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Bluetooth settings.
- 3 Tap **Scan for devices**. The Bluetooth devices found will be listed under **Bluetooth** devices.
- 4 Select the Bluetooth device that you want to pair with your phone.
- 5 Enter a passcode, if required.
- You can now start using the paired Bluetooth device. The status of the pairing and connection is shown below the name of the Bluetooth device in the **Bluetooth devices** list.
- Make sure that the device you want to pair your phone with has the Bluetooth™ function activated and Bluetooth visibility turned on.

#### To connect the phone to another Bluetooth™ device

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Bluetooth settings.
- 3 In the Bluetooth devices list, touch and hold the Bluetooth device that you want to connect to your phone.
- 4 Tap Connect.

#### To disconnect a Bluetooth™ device

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Bluetooth settings.
- 3 In the Bluetooth devices list, touch and hold the name of the connected Bluetooth device.
- 4 Tap Disconnect.
- Even if you disconnect a Bluetooth device, the device is still paired with your phone. To remove the pairing, you need to tap **Disconnect & unpair**.

#### To unpair a Bluetooth™ device

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > Wireless controls > Bluetooth settings.
- In the Bluetooth devices list, touch and hold the name of the connected Bluetooth device.
- 4 Tap Unpair.

# Media Go™

The Media Go™ computer application helps you transfer and manage media content in your phone and computer. The Media Go™ application is available for download from www.sonyericsson.com/support.

You need one of these operating systems to use the Media Go™ application:

- Microsoft® Windows 7
- Microsoft® Windows Vista™
- Microsoft® Windows® XP, Service Pack 3 or higher
   To be able to transfer files between Media Go™ and your phone you must first connect
   the phone with a USB cable and mount the memory card of the phone.
- To learn more about how to use the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application, see the help section in the main menu of the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application.
- You can also install some computer applications from the memory card of your phone. Connect your phone to a computer with a USB cable, and browse the memory card of your phone from the file explorer of the computer.

#### To transfer content using the Media Go™ application

- 1 Make sure you have downloaded and installed the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application from www.sonyericsson.com/support.
- 2 Connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable.
- 3 Computer: Select Media Go<sup>™</sup> from the start menu to start the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application.
- 4 Move files between your phone and the computer in the Media Go™ application.

With Sony Ericsson Mediascape you have one place for all your media content. You can browse media by the categories music, video and photo. You can use Sony Ericsson Mediascape to browse local media content on your memory card such as music, audiobooks, podcasts, photos, and videos. You can also access online content, for example, by browsing and purchasing music from the PlayNow<sup>TM</sup> service, or by exploring related content on the YouTube<sup>TM</sup> service.

#### To open Sony Ericsson Mediascape

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap "Mediascape".
- 2 Depending on which media you want to use, tap "Music" ☐, "Video" ☒ or "Photo" ☒ at the bottom of the screen. The first time you open any of the home screens, your content might not be displayed.
- 3 To browse content on your memory card, tap "More" in the upper part of the screen.

# **Exploring related media content**

In Sony Ericsson Mediascape you can find and explore media content which is related to an artist you are listening to or a photo you are viewing by tapping the Infinite button ...

When browsing or listening to music, you can search for music content related to a particular artist. Sony Ericsson Mediascape lists results found on:

- the memory card in your phone
- the PlayNow<sup>™</sup> service or another available online service
- the YouTube™ service

When you are viewing a photo taken by the camera in the phone, you can find other photos taken by the camera on the same day, at same location, or which feature the same person.

# Viewing detailed information about media content

You can view detailed information about audio, photo and video content by touching and holding the screen in the player you are using. The information that appears depends on the kind of content you are playing or viewing.

#### To view additional information about media content

- 1 In the music, photo or video player, touch and hold the center of the screen until the information tile appears.
- 2 To explore related media content, tap . (if available).
- 3 Release the screen to close the information tile.

# Stereo portable handsfree



#### To use a handsfree

- Connect a portable handsfree. Music stops when you receive a call and resumes when the call has ended.
- If a portable handsfree is not included with the phone, you may purchase it separately.
- If you are using regular headphones without a microphone, you have to remove the headphones from the headset connector to be able to answer the call.

# **Copyright protected content**

Some of the items or content that you want to access may be copyright protected by DRM (Digital Rights Management). You may not be able to copy, send or transfer such items. You need to acquire or renew the license to do that. Follow the instructions when you come across DRM protected content.

You may not be able to access some functions while accessing DRM protected content.

# Music in Sony Ericsson Mediascape

You can browse and listen to your music, audio books and podcasts using Sony Ericsson Mediascape. You can also purchase music from online services (if available) using Sony Ericsson Mediascape.

Use the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application to transfer content to and from the memory card in your phone. For more information, see *Transferring and handling content* on page 53.

#### To browse audio content on your memory card

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap "Mediascape".
- 2 If the music home screen is not shown, tap "Music" ☐. The first time you open the music home screen, it may not display your music in the predefined playlists.
- 3 In the upper part of the screen, tap "More".
- 4 Flick left or right to view items by category.

#### Music home screen

The music home screen has two parts, the upper part contains locally stored audio content, and the lower part shows online audio content. When online content is not available, the lower part shows local content.

If your country of residence does not support the PlayNow™ service, your operator may provide an alternative service, or services. If there is no alternative service, automatically generated playlists appear in the lower part of the music home screen in Sony Ericsson Mediascape.

You can check with your network operator for alternative service, or services.

#### To play audio content

#### To fast forward and rewind music

# **Playlists**

Sony Ericsson Mediascape has automatically generated playlists in the music home screen. You can also create your own playlists. You can use the Media  $Go^{TM}$  application to maintain your music library, and to create playlists. Playlists that you create yourself have to be in the m3u format and have to be stored on the memory card in the phone. When you connect the phone to your computer using the USB cable, the memory card appears in the Media  $Go^{TM}$  application. #### To copy playlists to your memory card

- 1 Start the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application on your computer.
- 2 Connect the phone to the computer using the USB cable.
- 3 Locate the memory card in the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application.
- 4 Copy existing playlists from your computer to the memory card by dragging and dropping the playlists.

## **Podcasts**

Podcasts are media content, for example, radio programs or TV shows, which you can subscribe to using web feeds. You can download the content to your computer using the podcast feature in the Media  $Go^{TM}$  application. You can then copy the podcast to the memory card in your phone using the Media  $Go^{TM}$  application. You can also start a subscription in your phone by browsing to a web page which has audio feeds or video feeds. When there is updated content you receive an alert in the status bar of your phone. # To play podcasts in your phone

- 2 Select category depending on podcast type, for example, "Music", to play audio podcasts.

# TrackID™ technology

TrackID™ technology is a music recognition service. You can search for title, artist and album name for a track you hear playing through a loudspeaker. For best results, use TrackID™ technology in a quiet area. You can recommend tracks to others. You can also purchase tracks you find using TrackID™ technology. You can search for and view related content on YouTube™. If you cannot use TrackID™ technology, see *I cannot use Internet-based services* on page 90.

#### To open the TrackID™ application

From the Home screen, tap the applications bar and tap TrackID™.

#### To search for track information

- 1 When the **TrackID™** application is open, hold the phone towards the music source.
- 2 Tap **Record**. The results are shown as track info in the result screen.
- 3 To return to the **TrackID™** start screen, press <□.

# Using TrackID™ technology results

Track information appears when a track is recognised after a search, but also in a history list. When a track has been recognised by TrackID™ technology, you can purchase the track, recommend it, or find related content for the track on the YouTube™ service.

#### To use TrackID™ technology results

- 1 Tap one of the keys in the track information screen to purchase, recommend, or view the track on the YouTube™ service.

- 3 Select a photo sharing service and follow the instructions on the screen.

# Adding names to faces in photos

When you take a photo of one or more faces, face recognition tags are automatically added to the faces. You can then link a face with a name by creating a contact in the phonebook for the person whose face is in the photo. When you have given a name to a face, the face recognition feature will add name tags to all photos of that person. When viewing a photo, you can tap the name tag of a person in the photo and then tap to view all photos which include this person. If a face is not recognised, the tag "Unknown" appears. You can tap this tag and link the face to a contact in the phonebook.

#### To add names to faces in photos

- 1 Make sure you have created a contact in the phonebook for the person that you want to link to a face tag in a photo.
- 2 When viewing the photo, tap the "Unknown" face tag.
- 3 Tap "Change name".
- 4 Select a contact.

# To change the name of an existing face tag

- 1 Tap the face tag in the photo.
- 2 Tap "Change name".
- 3 Select a contact to link the face tag to.

# To communicate with a contact by tapping its face tag

- 1 When viewing a photo, tap a face tag which has a name.
- 2 Tap "View contact".
- 3 Tap a phone number to make a call, or tap "Messaging" or an email address to send a message.





# Tips when using the camera

#### Rule of thirds

Don't place your subject in the middle of the frame. By placing it a third of the way in, you achieve a better result.

#### Hold it steady

Avoid blurry photos by holding the camera steady. Try to steady your hand by leaning it against a solid object. You can also use the self-timer to make sure that the phone is steady when the photo is taken.

#### Get closer

By getting as close as possible to your subject, you can avoid relying on the zoom. Try to fill the viewfinder with your subject.

#### Stay within the flash range

Photos taken beyond the maximum flash range will be too dark. The maximum flash range is about four steps from the subject.

#### Consider variety

Think about different angles, and move towards the object. Take some vertical photos. Try different positions.

#### Use a plain background

A plain background helps highlight your subject.

#### Keep your lens clean

Mobile phones are used in all kinds of weather and places, and carried in pockets and bags. This results in the camera lens becoming dirty and covered with fingerprints. Use a soft cloth to clean the lens.

# **Updating your phone**

You can update your phone to the most recent software for optimal performance and to get the latest enhancements. Updates can be downloaded wirelessly directly from your phone via the Internet by using a 2G/3G mobile data connection, or by using a Wi-Fi network connection. You can also download updates from the Update service application on your computer, by connecting the phone and computer with a USB cable. When updating using the Update service application, you can either just download updates to your current phone operating system, or make a full reset and update of the phone operating system.

- When you are using a 2G/3G mobile data connection to connect to Internet from your phone, data transmission charges may apply. Contact your network operator for more information.
- Make sure you back up and save all data contained in your phone before you start updating the phone.

# To download software updates wirelessly

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Settings > About phone > "Software update".
- 3 Tap "Update now" > OK > OK. The phone will now search for software updates.

# **Updating your phone using Update service**

You can update your phone using a USB cable and the Sony Ericsson *Update service* application. You need a USB cable and an Internet-connected PC. # **Location services**

There are two ways to find your location, using Mobile networks or GPS technology. Mobile networks technology determines your position fast but accuracy may vary. If you use GPS technology it may take a little longer, but it will find your exact position. You can enable both Mobile networks and GPS to benefit from both technologies when trying to find your position.

# **GPS**

Your phone has a GPS receiver that uses satellite signals to calculate your location. Some GPS features use the Internet. Data rates and charges may apply.

When you use features that require the GPS receiver to find your location, make sure you have a clear view of the sky. If the GPS receiver does not find your location after a few minutes, you should move to another location. To help the search, stand still and do not cover the GPS antenna. The first time you use the GPS it may take up to 10 minutes before your location is found.



- If you cannot use some GPS features, see I cannot use Internet-based services on page 90.
- Sony Ericsson does not warrant the accuracy of any location services including but not limited to navigational services.

# Using maps

The Google Maps™ application lets you view your current location, find other locations and calculate routes. When you start the Google Maps application, your approximate location

is shown using information from nearby mobile towers. Your location is updated with a more precise position when the GPS receiver finds your location.

- Make sure you enable the location settings before trying to get your position.
- If the screen orientation does not change automatically when you turn the phone sideways, mark the Orientation check box under Settings > Sound & display.

# To use Google Maps

- 1 From the **Home** screen, tap the applications bar.
- 2 Tap Google Maps.
- The Google Maps application may not be available in every market.

# **Getting driving directions**

# SIM card protection

# My phone is not working as expected

# Resetting the phone
